

**OFFICIAL MINUTES
OF THE
CITY OF KEWAUNEE COMMON COUNCIL
REGULAR MEETING
SEPTEMBER 8, 2014**

Mayor Blaha called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. whereas the Pledge of Allegiance was recited followed by prayer and meditation.

State Senator Tiffany introduced himself to the Council and commented on the work within the Harbor area that is being planned and his support to see that Kewaunee can obtain funding at the State level.

Tom Fontana and Scott Meyer of Arrowhead Strategies appeared before the Council to introduce themselves to provide an update on their activities in pursuing funding for the Harbor projects at the State level and activities that will occur in the near future.

Mark Hinsch appeared before the Council to present signs he donated for the Kewaunee High School Boys and Girls State Champions to be placed as a part of the Kewaunee Welcome Sign by the Water Tower.

The Council received the Finance Committee minutes of August 11, 2014.

D. Kickbusch moved and Griffith seconded to approve the August 2014 Accounts Payables in the amount of \$438,580.99. Upon a roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

The Council received the Public Works Committee minutes of August 11 and 26, 2014.

Vollenweider moved and D. Kickbusch seconded to prohibit parking on the west side of First Street between Miller and Ellis Streets. Motion carried unanimously.

Christman moved and Gilbertson seconded to approve the August 11, 2014 Regular Council Meeting minutes as submitted. Motion carried unanimously.

Public Works Director Petersen reported on the success of the Veteran's Fishing Outing with over 41 veterans and 19 boats participating.

Fire Chief Hlinak reported on the delivery of the new First Response Vehicle donated by the Kewaunee Nuclear Plant and that it will be available for inspection after the meeting.

With the renovated Swoboda Grandfather Clock now positioned in its new location at the Skateboard Park area, Public Works Director Petersen asked that the Council give consideration of removing a couple of trees that block the view of the clock from the street.

Mayor Blaha reported on a Mayor's Challenge golf outing to be held on September 27, 2014.

The Council was informed of the Grulkowski Arbitrator Award decision that was not in favor of the City.

Christman moved and Kunkel seconded to adjourn the meeting at 8:03 p.m. Motion carried unanimously.
